

Several confirmed cases of H1N1 flu has been reported among the Lynnville-Sully students. This is no reason to be alarmed, but be aware to flu-like symptoms and react accordingly. Please be certain to follow the Department of Public Health recommendations to keep ill or feverish students home from school until they are fever free for 24 hours. Every effort will be made to continue our educational practices as best we can for all students, while at the same time taking precautions to safeguard students from unnecessary risk of exposure.

We did have our custodians disinfect surfaces over the weekend and will continue to take more stringent precautions until this outbreak is over. Teachers are given hand sanitizer and disinfectant wipes, but as we have seen in neighboring districts, this flu spreads fast and can last for several days. We need everyone's cooperation to contain the outbreak as much as possible.

Lynnville-Sully School District will continue to update families and staff on the latest information regarding H1N1. We want to assure you that we are taking preventative measures to keep our students safe and healthy at school. As we receive up-to-date information, it will be posted on our website, sent home in with students or e-mail, and published in the Hawk Talk.
